- a. A draft title for your research project
- b. The problem being addressed in your project
- c. The types of quantitative and qualitative data that you will collect
- d. The purpose of your study (for example, a dissertation project, a university project, etc.)

Additional Information Needed

Please submit:

- a. a **letter of recommendation** from your supervisor outlining how you would benefit from attending the workshop
- b. a **letter/certificate** indicating proof of student or faculty status from your university or place of work.
